Chairman Cloud submitted candidate and local option petitions in question. Deputy Director Bucaro confirmed that all candidates on this list were notified about their petition deficiencies. Member Hall asked if the office was helping candidates as much as possible. Deputy Director Bucaro confirmed that the office is always willing to help candidates and the office hosted two candidate training classes this year.

Deputy Director Bucaro explained that the St. Clair fire levy did not contain the correct election date, and the life squad issue listed the incorrect year that they were going to begin collecting the tax. She also informed the Board that the Prosecutor's office contacted Gary Sheets as the township's legal authority and advised that the township could file a new resolution correcting the errors. When the new resolution was filed, it was signed by Gary Sheets and not the Fiscal Officer, Douglas Wheelright. The Prosecutor's office advised there is no legal authority in Ohio Law to allow the Fiscal Officer to delegate his authority to sign the resolution via text message and therefore does not have a standard procedural history. The Prosecutor's office did try to contact the township but there was no response, leaving the decision to the Board.

Deputy Director Bucaro noted the City of Trenton filed a charter amendment that did not list the election date. They have been advised of the problem and we expect they will file a correction. Charter amendments can be filed as late as sixty days before the election so the Board may have one more issue to certify at the next meeting.

Under Old Business, Director Noonan updated the Board about an hour-long meeting with Charlie Young, the County Administrator. Deputy Director Bucaro informed that Board that during the meeting the County Administrator said it is not currently a priority for the County Commissioners to fund a new voting system, but it is possible to change the

Commissioner's priorities. The County Administrator asked for specific data that would outline the need for a new voting system. Deputy Director Bucaro explained some of the data that was sent, such as 149 machines that are completely unusable and about 50 machines that need repairs after each election. Other data includes the number of reissued ballots due to voting machine issues. Member Hall asked for clarification that there were fewer issues in the November 2016 election than the November 2014 election. Deputy Director Bucaro explained the reduction in issues is due to training. The next data set shows the number of double votes caused by machine issues. She explained that voters who are not sure their vote was counted, return to the poll workers, have a new ballot issued and vote a second time. Member Wunnenberg asked if this is also an issue that can be resolved through training. Deputy Director Bucaro answered yes, part of the problem is with training, but it is also due to the machine problems voters are experiencing. Director Noonan stated one problem with the voting machines is continuing to find replacement parts.

Member Hall asked for a rough figure of the cost of a new system. Director Noonan answered \$3-6 million to purchase a new voting system. Member Hall asked if there are any state funds for Butler County to use towards the purchase of a new voting system. Deputy Director Bucaro stated there are no state funds for Butler County to use towards the purchase of a new voting system.

Member Hall asked if there is a company that services the machines, and noted fixing 149 machines must be less expensive than purchasing a new system. Member Wyenandt mentioned service costs can add up over time.

Chairman Cloud asked Database Administrator Jay Klein, who joined the meeting for this discussion, if there are other issues with the current voting system that have not been discussed yet. Klein reminded the Board of the issue uploading paper ballots in November 2015. He explained how uploading paper ballots is the same as uploading memory cards and if memory cards in the future do not upload, it would cause many hours of extra work. Deputy Director Bucaro said that scenario happened in Portage County Ohio in November 2015, which led them to replace their system before the 2016 Primary.

Member Wunnenberg said the staff should do everything it can with the current resources to keep the system functioning and reliable as well as continue to lobby at the state level.

Deputy Director Bucaro added that the County Commissioners have not approved creating an election technology fund where money returned to the Board of Elections is kept on the side to fund the purchases for future equipment.

Member Wyenandt stated voter confidence is very important as well as staff confidence in the voting system. She indicated the office should continue to raise the concerns such as the number of double votes.

Member Wunnenberg said technology is changing and it would be wonderful to have the newest and best but in his opinion the election with 112,525 votes was extremely accurate. He asked why we would consider purchasing a system this year right before a major election year when the Board did not want to replace during a presidential year. Deputy Director Bucaro responded by saying replacing the voting system in 2018 would not be ideal.

Deputy Director Bucaro clarified when she came to work at the Board the lawsuit, filed in 2008 by the Secretary of State including all the counties that had this voting system, was settled by the state but still open with Butler County. She explained that at the time the Board was considering a new voting system but was not happy with any of the alternatives systems available and instead took electronic poll books in the settlement. The Secretary of State also made counties with this system install new software to strengthen the system and patch known problems.

The Board meeting then went back to Election Business as Director Noonan explained candidate Zipporah Samples brought in signed affidavits from voters explaining that they did personally sign her petition. Deputy Director Bucaro further explained that when the office reviewed the petitions, it appeared one person signed more than just their own name, disqualifying those part-petitions Deputy Director Bucaro reminded the Board that in the past the Board has considered sworn statements from voters attesting to their signatures.

Member Wunnenberg moved to certify Zipporah Samples to the November 7, 2017 General Election; seconded by Member Hall. Roll call:

Under the Director's Report, Director Noonan stated the Poll Worker Department has currently recruited 414 Democratic, 582 Republican and 137 No Party workers for the November Election. The goal each election is 1,400 workers which leaves 257 more workers to recruit.

Under the Deputy Director's Report, Deputy Director Bucaro notified the Board that the mock election for new electronic poll books, which had been scheduled for August 18, 2017, was rescheduled to August 30, 2017. Training materials for the new poll books are coming along and election preparation is coming along well. She also explained that some temporary staff members will be starting soon.

With no further business, Member Hall moved to adjourn; seconded by Member Wyenandt.
