Early Voting Opens on Tuesday, October 6, 2020 for the November 3, 2020 General Election

Extended hours offered to voters.

HAMILTON, OH: The Butler County Board of Elections will be open for early voting beginning Tuesday, October 6, 2020, at 8:00 a.m. for voters wishing to vote in-person prior to the Election on November 3, 2020.

The Board will be open for in-person early voting during the following hours:

Week 1: October 6 – October 9

8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on each weekday (Tuesday through Friday)

Week 2: October 12 – October 16

8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on each weekday (Monday through Friday)

Week 3: October 19 – October 25

8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. on each weekday (Monday through Friday)

8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on Saturday, October 24

1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Sunday, October 25

Week 4: October 26 – November 1

8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on each weekday (Monday through Friday)

8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on Saturday, October 31 (Saturday before Election Day)

1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Sunday, November 1 (Sunday before Election Day)

Week of Election Day: November 2

8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. on Monday, November 2 (Monday before Election Day)

Voters may also vote absentee by mail:

The completed application must be received by noon on Saturday, October 31, 2020. An application may be downloaded from our website: elections.bcoho.gov, or voters may call the Board of Elections to request an application at (513) 887-3700.

Voter's written request for a vote-by-mail ballot MUST include the following information:

- Name and current address
- Date of Birth
- Mailing address for the ballot, if different than current address
- **One Form** of Identification:
 - last four digits of your social security number
 - driver's license number
 - copy of a current and valid photo ID
 - current utility bill (including cell phone bill)
 - bank statement
 - government check
 - paycheck
 - Other government document that includes the voter's name and address
- The Election in which you intend to vote and the election date (November 3, 2020)
- A statement indicating the voter is a qualified elector
- Voter's signature

Ballots returned by mail must be postmarked no later than Monday, November 2, 2020, and must be received by the Board of Elections no later than Friday, November 13, 2020, ten (10) days after the election. Ballots may be delivered in-person by the voter or voter's family member to the Board office by close of polls (7:30 p.m.) on Election Day.

Voters with a qualifying disability under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) may request an accessible ballot by filling out Secretary of State form 11-G.

If a voter or voter's minor child is hospitalized due to a medical emergency on Election Day, you should contact the Board of Elections. Voters with such an emergency may apply for an absentee ballot until 3:00 p.m. on Election Day.



Vote by mail ballots may **not** be returned to a polling location on Election Day.

Out-of-country Civilian and Uniformed Armed Service ballots must be received by the Board of Elections by Friday, November 13, 2020, ten (10) days after the election to be counted.

Directions to the Board of Elections:

Rt.129 to Hampshire Drive. Turn left on Princeton Road, and the Board of Elections is located at the end of the road on the right, directly in front of the County Care Facility.
