HAMILTON, OH: The Butler County Board of Elections will be open for early voting beginning Wednesday, February 21, 2024, at 8:00 a.m. for voters wishing to vote in-person prior to the Election on March 19, 2024.

The Board will be open for in-person early voting during the following hours:

Week 1: February 21-February 23

8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on each weekday (Wednesday through Friday)

Week 2: February 26 – March 1

8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on each weekday (Monday through Friday)

Week 3: March 4 - March 9

8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on each weekday (Monday through Friday) 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m on Saturday

Week 4: March 11 - March 17

7:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. (Monday, March 11th)

7:30 a.m. to 8:30 p.m. (Tuesday, March 12th)

7:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. (Wednesday, March 13th through Friday, March 15th)

8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on Saturday, March 16th (Saturday before Election Day)

1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Sunday, March 17th (Sunday before Election Day)

The completed application must be received by the close of business on **Tuesday, March 12, 2024**. An application may be downloaded from our website: <u>elections.bcohio.gov</u>, or voters may call the Board of Elections to request an application be mailed at (513) 887-3700.

Ballots returned by mail must be postmarked no later than **Monday**, **March 18**, **2024**, and must be received by the Board of Elections no later than **Saturday**, **March 23**, **2024**, in order to count. Ballots may be delivered inperson by the voter or voter's family member to the Board office by close of polls (7:30 p.m.) on Election Day.

Vote-by-mail ballots may **not** be returned to a polling location on Election Day.

Voters with a qualifying disability under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) may request an accessible ballot by completing Secretary of State form 11-G.

If a voter or voter's minor child is hospitalized due to a medical emergency on Election Day, you should contact the Board of Elections. Voters with such an emergency may apply for an absentee ballot until 3:00 p.m. on Election Day.

Out-of-country Civilian and Uniformed Armed Service ballots must be received by the Board of Elections by **Saturday, March 23, 2024**, in order to count.
